How does each piece move?

King - 1 slow step at a time, any direction
Queen - any direction, as far as she wants
Bishop - green or white diagonals, however
many steps they want

Knights - gallop, gallop, step to the side (in an "L" formation" & can jump

Rooks - straight up/down/side to side,

however many steps they want
Pawns - 1 step forward, or 2 steps from
"home"
